You can be sure that you are saved. You can be sure that Jesus saved you and that you have eternal life right now. All the questions above help to make you sure. You must stand on the promises of God. God never lies. Believe His Word. Don't trust your feelings, but instead trust His Word alone. When we ask Jesus to be our personal Savior, we are trust Him to save us and He will keep His word to us.

I would ask you to read John 3:1-7 and 1:1-13. You will see that Jesus said we must be **born again.** To be born again means to receive Christ as our Savior, to put our full trust in Him alone. Jesus told Nicodemus, a ruler of the Jews, that he must be born again. **To be "born again" means to be born into God's family**. This ruler of the Jews, Nicodemus, was one of the spiritual rulers, yet he needed to be born again. Since that was true of him, it is true of us also.

"That which is born of the flesh is flesh." Here Christ was speaking about a physical birth in John 3:6. **Then Jesus said**, *"Ye must be born again!"* in John 3:7. Consider the following:

How to Grow For Jesus!

Begin reading the Bible every day. It would be good to begin your reading by reading through the Gospel of John. Read it many, many times for this will help you to grow spiritually.

LEARN TO PRAY

Only those who are saved have a right to pray. Prayer is talking to the Heavenly Father who has become our Father through our trusting His Son as our Lord and Savior. Prayer is talking to God. So how can unsaved people talk to a God whom they do not know? It is our great joy and privilege that we can bring every need to the Lord.

Here are some things about which you should pray:

- l. Tell Him of our love to Him.
- 2. Confess your sins daily as His child, asking for forgiveness so that you can stay in daily fellowship. (I John 1:9)
- 3. Pray about your needs each day -- pray for wisdom, for strength to live for Jesus, for every concern and burden that you might have.
- 4. Pray for the needs of others: for your parents, brothers, sisters, church, pastor, Bible teachers, missionaries, and those who are unsaved and need Christ.

You do not have to pray aloud for Jesus to hear you. God can hear your prayers even if you say them quietly inside your own mind and heart. We need to be sincere, and not just think desires, but to truly ask of our Heavenly Father. God likes to talk to you, too. You should learn to read His Word and let Him talk to you through His Word. Then you will want to learn how to pray aloud in church and in prayer meetings with others.

To read God's Word and to learn to pray is very, very important for our walk with the Lord. It will help you to trust Jesus more and more. Remember to keep on asking Jesus in prayer. Remember to pray daily and to read His Word each day.

Take one of the specific prayer promises you have looked at as you answered the questions and claim that promise as you bring your petitions to the Lord in prayer. Then pray until you actually believe God has heard and will answer. Nothing can take the place of a specific time for daily communion with God. If we truly love Christ, then we need to show that love by our love to others. And we do that by wanting to share the things of Christ with them for we are to feed His sheep. A father will want to teach his children about Christ, how to be saved, to live for Christ and how serve Him and love Him.

I would encourage you to especially study chapters 14, 15, 16, and 17 in the Gospel of John. These are Christ's intimate words spoken to His own between being in the upper room with His disciples and going to the mock trial and to the cross only hours later. These were the special last words of Christ to the apostles or disciples prior to His death. They are like last words we might speak to our loved ones knowing that soon we will be leaving this earth.

Consider that Christ left a legacy for them and for us. Study these precious truths! Claim them as yours!

Some Things You Can DO For Others!

Ask God to help you to tell others about Christ's death on the cross and how they can put their faith in His sacrifice and payment for sins. As you live for the Lord Jesus you will face all kinds of dangers. It is just a part of daily life because we live in a world where sin has brought a many tragedies, disasters, failures, heartaches, and trials.

Because we have received Christ as Savior and He has given us *a new life, a new purpose for living, and a new outlook on life,* we will look at things differently than before. We won't like the old sinful ways, and we will be misunderstood by relatives and friends who do not know Christ as personal Savior. As we try to stand up for what is right and what pleases Christ we will probably be ridiculed by loved ones and friends. Expect this kind of trouble.

Lesson 11

Obeying The Lord In Baptism!

We have seen a number of things we should do in living for Jesus. Remember that you should read your Bible each day and spend time in prayer. Also, you should witness for Christ, telling others about how to trust Jesus as their Lord and Savior, too.

There is something else you should do. As soon as we are saved, we are to obey the Lord by being baptized.

JESUS TELLS US TO BE BAPTIZED!

Jesus, Himself was baptized. Reading Matthew 3:13-17. "Then cometh Jesus from Galilee to Jordan unto John, to be baptized of Him. But John forbade him, saying, I have need to be baptized of thee, and comest thou to me? And Jesus answering said unto him, Suffer it to be so now: for this it becometh us to fulfill all righteousness. Then he suffered him. And Jesus, when he was baptized, went up straightway out of the water: and lo, the heavens were open unto him, and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and lighting upon him: and lo, a voice from heaven, saying, This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased. "

Then Jesus commanded us to be baptized: Here we read Matthew 28:18-20. "And Jesus came and spake unto them, saying, All power is given unto me in heaven and in earth. Go ye therefore, and teach (disciple or show how to be saved) all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world. Amen"

Baptism does not take away our sins. Christ died to pay for sins. God can forgive us our sins because Jesus died to save us from those sins and give us eternal life. Water

cannot take away sin. The water did not die for us; Christ did. There are those who teach that baptism removes sins. If that was true why did Jesus die for our sins?

Baptism does not save you. <u>We are to be baptized because we are already saved and</u> <u>not in order to be saved</u>. <u>Salvation is only in Christ</u>. When we are baptized we are telling everyone who is watching that we are already saved and trusting in what Christ did and that only. We are also telling others that we want to live for Him, that is why we are obeying the Lord's command that we are to be baptized. We must be baptized **after** we are saved in order to obey the Lord Jesus.

WE ARE TO BE SAVED BEFORE WE ARE BAPTIZED!

Every time we read in the Word of God about someone who was baptized, we see that FIRST he was saved from his sins. We are to be sure FIRST that Jesus is our Savior and that we are trusting His death on the cross as the payment for our sins, and that ONLY.

The following verses from the book of Acts tells of people who were baptized and how they trusted Christ first.

Acts 2:41 "Then they that gladly received his word were baptized: and the same day there were added unto them about three thousand souls."

In Acts 8:12 we read: "But when they believed Philip preaching the things concerning the kingdom of God, and the name of Jesus Christ, they were baptized, both men and women."

You will notice from this verse that **they first heard** about how to be in the kingdom of God and about salvation in the name of Christ, and believed. **Then they were baptized.** They were preaching about being born again. We noticed in John 3:1-7, and John 1:12,13 what this means.

Again in Acts 8:35-39 we read that Philip preached about Jesus to the eunuch. "Then Philip opened his mouth, and began at the same Scripture and preached unto him Jesus." (Notice he was preaching about Jesus and that means to tell how He PAID FOR ALL OUR SINS. Look at Acts 4:12.) "And as they went on their way, they came unto a certain water: and the eunuch said, See here is water; what doth hinder me to be baptized? And Philip said, If thou believest with all thine heart, thou mayest. And he answered and said, I believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God. And he commanded the chariot to stand still: and they went down both into the water, both Philip and the eunuch; and he baptized him."

These portions of Scripture tell us that we are to be saved first, that is, trust in Christ first, and then obey Him by being baptized. We are baptized because we trust Christ, NOT to have our sins washed away, but because they are forgiven through Christ's death alone.

WHAT BAPTISM MEANS OR WHAT IT PICTURES !

Baptism is like an object lesson. It is something Jesus commanded us to do after we are saved. It pictures a number of things:

1. It is a symbol that we belong to God! Jesus was baptized as an outward act that He was God's. Then God said, *"This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased "* (Matthew 3:17). Read all of Matthew 3:13-17.

If baptism saved then we would have to say this was when Jesus had His sins washed away.

When we are baptized, it is a **symbol** to all who see that we are trusting Christ and therefore we belong to God. Just as a wedding ring is a symbol that someone is married and belongs to the one whom he or she has married, so baptism is a symbol that we are not our own. We are God's.

2. It is a testimony that we are saved and have a new life in Christ. (Read Romans 6:3-5 printed below.)

"Know ye not, that so many of us as were baptized into Jesus Christ were baptized into his death? Therefore we are buried with him by baptism into death: that like as Christ was raised up from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life. For if we have been planted in the likeness of his death, we shall be also in the likeness of his resurrection. "

When were we planted in the likeness of his death? We were planted in the likeness of his death when we are baptized. We were put into the water signifying or picturing His death, and brought out of the water as a picture of Christ's resurrection.

We are baptized in order to obey the Lord and to show to all who watch that we are saved from our sins and we want to live for Jesus. When we are immersed in the water, our baptism shows our death to our old way of life. When we are raised up from the water, it shows our resurrection to a new life given to us by Christ's death on the cross.

So our baptism is an act of dedication! We are giving ourselves to the Lord to live for Him. We are saying we are leaving behind our old life and are going to live for Jesus. We won't live for Him perfectly, but we should have a great desire to love and serve Him.

3. It is a picture of the death, burial, and resurrection of Christ.

We are told in Romans 6:3-6 that when we go into the water and are lowered into the water (immersion), we are picturing Christ's death. . death for our sins, burial in the grave, and resurrection from the dead.

Because He died for us and is a living Savior, we can be saved and have eternal life RIGHT NOW! Our baptism pictures the finished work of Christ whereby we are saved. Our baptism pictures what Christ DID for us whereby we are saved as we trust Him. And He is in heaven for the cross is empty and the grave is empty. He is ALIVE! (John 11:25,26)

When someone is baptized, usually the pastor stands in the water and the new Christian (or the person just newly saved) stands beside him. The pastor may ask the person if he really is trusting Jesus as his Savior. Then the pastor will lower this new believer down into the water and bring him up again quickly. The act is a picture of Christ's death, burial and resurrection. (Read I Corinthians 15:14.)

You should desire to be baptized after you accepted Christ as your personal Savior. You do this because you love the Lord Jesus and because you know you are saved from your sins. You do this to obey Christ, who died for you.

A Child Shall Lead Them!

A mother and father, who sent their little boy to Sunday School but didn't go themselves, slipped upstairs to hear him say his prayers. After the general run of words he said, "And dear God, please help mommy and daddy learn about you like I have. Help them to be good *Christians, too. Make them like to go to church with me, please help them!*" With tears streaming down his face, the father turned to the mother and asked, *"What are we going to do to about it?" "We'll answer his prayers,"* she replied.
